

**GOVERNOR'S PROCLAMATION DECLARING THE RESULT OF
THE ELECTION OF NOVEMBER 3, 2020
FOR CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS**

WHEREAS, the General Assembly of Maryland at its Regular Session of 2020 enacted Chapter 645 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2020, "Balancing the State Budget," proposing amendments to the Constitution of Maryland;

WHEREAS, the above recited Acts and Article XIV of the Constitution provide for the submission of the amendments to the legal and qualified voters of the State for their adoption or rejection, at the election held on November 3, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Acts were submitted to the legal and qualified voters of the State during that election and the certified copies of the returns of the election were as follows:

As to Chapter 645 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2020 relating to Balancing the State Budget (Question No. 1): 2,033,605 votes were cast for the adoption, and 689,975 votes were cast against the adoption;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LARRY HOGAN, GOVERNOR, pursuant to Section 1 of Article XIV of the Constitution of Maryland, do, by this Proclamation, declare and proclaim that Chapter 645 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2020, having received the majority of votes cast for the adoption, shall become part of the Constitution of the State of Maryland.


**GOVERNOR'S PROCLAMATION DECLARING
THE RESULT OF THE ELECTION OF
NOVEMBER 3, 2020, REGARDING GAMING EXPANSION**

- WHEREAS, the General Assembly of Maryland at its Regular Session of 2020 enacted Chapter 492, "Expansion of Commercial Gaming — Sports and Event Wagering Referendum and Minority Business Enterprise Disparity Study," providing for, among other things, changes to commercial gaming laws in Maryland;
- WHEREAS, Section 1 of the above recited Act authorized additional forms and expansion of commercial gaming;
- WHEREAS, Section 5 of the Act required that, in accordance with Article XIX, Section 1(e), of the Constitution of Maryland, before Section 1 of the Act became effective, the question of authorizing additional forms and expansion of commercial gaming was to be submitted to a referendum of the qualified voters of the State at the general election held in November of 2020;
- WHEREAS, Section 5(b) of the Act states that if a majority of the votes cast on the question are "For the referred law," the Act shall become effective on the 30th day following the official canvass of votes for the referendum;
- WHEREAS, The Act was submitted to the qualified voters of the State during the election of November 3, 2020, and from the certified copies of the returns of the election:
- As to the authorization of additional forms and expansion of commercial gaming (Question No. 02), 1,904,098 votes were cast "For the referred law," and 934,950 votes were cast "Against the referred law"; and
- WHEREAS, The official canvass of votes for the referendum took place on December 4, 2020;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LARRY HOGAN, GOVERNOR, pursuant to Section 1(e) of Article XIX of the Constitution of Maryland and Section 5 of the Act, do, by this Proclamation, declare and proclaim that a majority of the votes were cast in favor of authorization of additional forms and expansion of commercial gaming, and, therefore, the Act will take effect on January 4, 2021.
